

6 Things You Need to Do After an Auto Accident

As a driver, you can get involved in an automobile accident when you least expect.

So, in a case where you get involved in a car crash, there are a few things that you need to know to keep yourself and your interests protected. In such a case, you should do the following:

1. Stop and protect the scene of a crime

As minor as an accident might be, it is not a good idea to flee from the scene of the crash. Care to protect the scene of the crash by keeping your flashers on or setting up flares to prevent other accidents from occurring.

2. Contact the police

However minor an accident might be, it is always important to get the police into the picture even if your injuries are not very serious. This will enable you to obtain a police report, which will be useful when filing a claim with your insurance company. The police report will also allow you to make a compensation claim with the least hassle in case your vehicle is damaged.

3. Keep an accurate record of the occurrences

It is wise to give accurate statements to the police upon the event of an accident. At no point should you speculate or answer questions with cases because you are not sure of what happened exactly. You should also understand that some injuries from accidents such as internal bleeding or blood clots after an impact may mislead you to think that you are not injured. For this reason, it is always wise to say that you are not sure if you have any injuries.

Also, care to take pictures and to exchange information with eyewitnesses at the scene of the accident in case the police department does not respond on time.

4. Notify your insurance company

Many companies require immediate cooperation when an accident occurs, and that includes reporting an accident case as soon as possible. Ensure that you find out if you have medical benefits in your insurance coverage to save yourself from medical bills.

5. Seek medical attention

After taking the above measures, you can now seek medical care. That will happen if the accident does not leave you unconscious or with serious injuries that need immediate medical attention. Even if the accident involved a minor impact, you should rule out any chances of injury by visiting a medical institution to ascertain that all is well.

6. Protect your rights

It is essential that you seek [legal counsel](#) and consult your attorney immediately after an accident occurs. Your attorney would be able to [advise you accordingly](#) on matters concerning your claim should you decide to make a compensation claim. An insurance company may also refuse to compensate you following the fact that you have not provided all the required evidence; hence you'll need an attorney to help your case pull through.

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
