

- It's important to acknowledge what kids know and what they are aware of ... even if they are very young or even if they have been labeled.
- When you understand how kids with autism communicate, your communication with them can go to a place that allows you and them greater ease.
- This book contains many practical tools that you can use to communicate more easily with these children.
- What if people with ADD and ADHD are the greatest multi-taskers in the universe? They are always looking for more sensory input.
