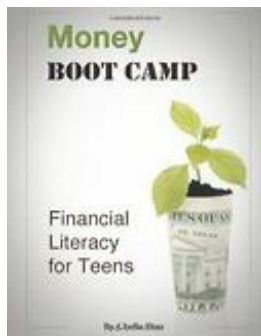


Meet Chella Diaz Best Selling Author of Money Bootcamp

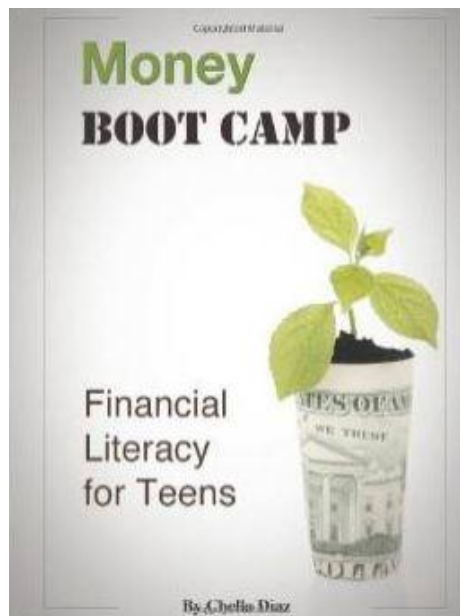
Chella Diaz Author of Money Boot Camp
